#### **EPHESIANS 1:1-14**

Salutation / Spiritual Blessings in Christ Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, To the saints who are in Ephesus and are faithful in Christ Jesus: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. #### My Dear Friends:

Everything in this weekend's gospel is excitement and motion: Mary's haste, her greeting to Elizabeth, John's leap for joy, Elizabeth's exclamation and Mary's thanksgiving. Mary is the first evangelist, the model of Christian belief. She brings Jesus to the world, starting with her cousin Elizabeth and Elizabeth's unborn son. In bringing the unborn Christ to Zechariah's house, Mary witnesses the fruits of Christ's presence. The babe in Elizabeth's womb professes his faith in a manner appropriate to an unborn child, while his mother professes her faith in Christ's presence to His mother.

St. Ambrose reminds us that this is not just an interesting, old story. Because Mary is the model of Christian belief, the story continues down through the ages, right up to this present moment:

You also are blessed because you have heard and believed. A soul that believes both conceives and brings forth the Word of God and acknowledges his works.

My friends, we need to remember this: it is also our vocation, as Christians, to bring the Word out into the world, and to bring it with joy and haste and excitement, just as it is portrayed in the Gospel today.

May you have a blessed and joyful week ahead.
