GOSPEL

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Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For

he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee. A leper came to him (and kneeling down) begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." EPISTLE

Romans 6:12-23

Therefore, sin must not reign over your mortal bodies so that you obey their desires. And do not present the parts of your bodies to sin as weapons for wickedness, but present yourselves to God as raised from the dead to life and the parts of your bodies to God as weapons for righteousness. For sin is not to have any power over you, since you are not under the law but under grace. What then? Shall we sin because we are not under the law but under grace? Of course not! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to someone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that, although you were once slaves of sin, you have become obedient from the heart to the pattern of teaching to which you were entrusted. Freed from sin, you have become slaves of righteousness. I am speaking in human terms because of the weakness of your nature. For just as you presented the parts of vour bodies as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness for lawlessness, so now present them as slaves to righteousness for sanctification. For when you were slaves of sin, you were free from righteousness. But what profit did you get then from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and have become slaves of God, the benefit that you have leads to sanctification, and its end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Praise be to God always.

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POPE FRANCIS ON PRAYER

Our prayer cannot be reduced to an hour on Sundays. It is important to have a daily relationship with the Lord.

Miracles happen. But prayer is needed! Prayer that is courageous, struggling and persevering, not prayer that is a mere formality.

The Pastor's Corner

My Dear Friends:

Our Holy Father, Pope Francis has declared 2024 to be the year of prayer. In declaring this, he said that the year will be dedicated *to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer, prayer in personal life, in the life of the Church, prayer in the world.*

Many people think of prayer as something very formal, something like saying the Our Father or the Hail Mary, and if they don't know any "real" prayers, then they don't know how to pray. Or if they think of prayer as something spontaneous, it is only when they ask God for help. Those are certainly ways of praying, but only a very small part. When we think of prayer, we should be thinking of a free flowing conversation with God.

What kind of conversations can we have with God? The same type we have with our loved ones, our family and friends. We say please when we ask for someone's help and thank when we have received it. We say I'm sorry when we've hurt someone and "I love you" any time it occurs to us. And this is exactly how we should speak with God.

Many people have no trouble asking God for something, but how many of us remember to thank Him, for the little things as well as the big mercies? How many of us say I'm sorry when we've sinned, (and follow that up by going to confession?) And how many of us remember to say *I love you Jesus* – just because?

Lent is an excellent time to start forming new prayer habits. Let's start this week by having many simple conversations with God, anytime and anywhere we are inspired to say please, thank, I'm sorry and I love you.

I pray that God will bless all of you in a special way this week and all during Great Lent.
