The Apostle said: The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him,

said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. EPISTLE

2 CORINTHIANS 4:5-15 The Paradox of the Ministry Brothers and Sisters:

We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture — "I believed, and so I spoke" — we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. Praise be to God always!

TWO IMPORTANT SAINTS FOR JANUARY




ST. ANTHONY THE GREAT FEAST DAY: JANUARY 17

Saint Anthony the Great was born into a wealthy family in upper Egypt about 251. He is also known as Anthony of Egypt, Anthony of the Desert, and Anthony the Anchorite. St. Anthony gave away all his wealth in order to more effectively follow Jesus's teachings. He was a leader among the Desert

Fathers - Christian monks in the Egyptian desert in the 3rd and 4th centuries.

St. Anthony had a powerful impact upon many people through his radical obedience to God's will, his life devoted to prayer, his embrace of poverty, his courageous preaching against heresy, and his assistance to those daring to live as hermits. He died in 356 on 17 January, age 105. He was proclaimed a saint almost immediately.

ST. EPHREM THE SYRIAN FEAST DAY: JANUARY 28

St. Ephrem was born about 306 in Nisibis, in modern-day Turkey. It was a difficult and tumultuous time for the church as there was still much persecution, and heresies, especially Arianism, were raging.

As a deacon, Saint Ephrem assisted priests in providing food and other aid to the poor, and in preaching the Gospel. He was a gifted writer, especially of hymns and poetry, and the hundreds of theological hymns and biblical commentaries he composed were a very effective tool for helping Christians understand the true faith. Because of his skill in composing hymns, the most popular title for St. Ephraim is the *Harp of the Holy Spirit*.

St. Ephrem died on 9 June 373 and was proclaimed a saint shortly after. In 1920, Pope Benedict XV declared St. Ephrem a Doctor of the Church.
