LUKE 3:15-22 The Evangelist said: As the people were filled with expectation, and



all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to

clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people. But Herod the ruler, who had been rebuked by him because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the evil things that Herod had done, added to them all by shutting up John in prison. Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." This is the truth. Peace be with you.

TITUS 2:11-3:7 Transformation of Life Brothers and Sisters:

The grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all, training us to renounce impiety and worldly passions, and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly, while we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ. #### **Choose a New Friend**

Choose a saint to learn about this year who will become your patron for 2024. Ask this saint regularly for his/her intercession and resolve to follow their example of holiness. If you don't know how to begin choosing a saint, try this site (put together by a Catholic programmer), which will give you a saint at random. https://saintsnamegenerator.com

#### Make a Swap

Do you listen to a lot of podcasts or spend hours searching the internet? Swap one worldy podcast or page for a Catholic one. Join a mailing list that will send you a Bible verse or Catholic meditation every day (and unsubscribe from a secular, distracting one.) Put your phone down for an hour and listen to a Catholic audio book or read something that nourishes your faith.

#### **Flee Temptation**

Do you have a bad habit you are struggling to break? Do you lose your temper? Are you pronte to gossip? Do you look at impure images online? Do you eat or drink to excess? Resolve to pray for help as soon as you feel tempted by your particular sin. Ask Jesus, Mary, St. Michael, your guardian angel and St. Sharbel to help you overcome the temptation.

#### **Give Up On Discouragement**

God never tells you to give up on good things, so if you feel as if there is no point in trying after you break your resolution, that's not from God! It is the devil trying to sabotage you and keep you trapped in sin and worldliness! Instead, resolve that you will start again every time you fail, get up every time you fall, and with God's help, you will still be working on yourself come December 2024, even if you have to start over again 1000 times this year!
