Mark 10:46-52



They came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept

calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, he is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. This is the Truth. Peace be with you.

### 2 CORINTHIANS 10:1-7

Now I myself, Paul, urge you through the gentleness and clemency of Christ, I who am humble when face to face with you, but brave toward you when absent, I beg you that, when present, I may not have to be brave with that confidence with which I intend to act boldly against some who consider us as acting according to the flesh. For, although we are in the flesh, we do not battle according to the flesh, for the weapons of our battle are not of flesh but are enormously powerful, capable of destroying fortresses. We destroy arguments and every pretension raising itself against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive in obedience to Christ, and we are ready to punish every disobedience, once your obedience is complete. ### PROVERBS CHAPTER 11:1-9

- 1 A false balance is an abomination to the Lord, but an accurate weight is his delight.
- When pride comes, then comes disgrace; but wisdom is with the humble.
- 3 The integrity of the upright guides them, but the crookedness of the treacherous destroys them.
- 4 Riches do not profit in the day of wrath, but righteousness delivers from death.
- 5 The righteousness of the blameless keeps their ways straight, but the wicked fall by their own wickedness.
- 6 The righteousness of the upright saves them, but the treacherous are taken captive by their schemes.
- 7 When the wicked die, their hope perishes, and the expectation of the godless comes to nothing.
- 8 The righteous are delivered from trouble, and the wicked get into it instead.
- 9 With their mouths the godless would destroy their neighbors, but by knowledge the righteous are delivered.

### My Dear Friends:

Our prayer this month is for families. You can see it below. Please try to pray it often.

Here are some more explanations of our Maronite liturgy:

**The Rite of Fraction** symbolizes the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ. The priest says: We have believed and have approached and now we seal and break this Oblation, the heavenly bread, the Body of the Word, who is the living God.

**The Signing** symbolizes the action of the Trinity in uniting the Body and Blood. The priest says: We sign this chalice of salvation and thanksgiving with the forgiving ember which glows with heavenly mysteries. Then, the priest dips the small particle into the cup, making with it the form of a cross saying, we sign this cup of salvation. Then, the celebrant dips the Body in the Blood three times saying, In the name of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

In **the Sprinkling**, the priest sprinkles the Body three times, using the small piece that has been dipped into the Blood saying: The Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ is sprinkled on his holy Body, in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

**The Mingling** symbolizes the uniting of Christ's Body and Blood. The celebrant drops the small piece into the Blood saying: *You have united, O Lord your divinity with our humanity ....* 

**The Elevation** symbolizes Christ's resurrection, ascension into heaven, and the completion of the mystery of redemption. The Celebrant joins the two halves of the Body and holds them in his right hand over the chalice which is held in his left hand. He elevates them and prays with the congregation. The priest says: *You are the pleasing Oblation who offered yourself for us...*
