Naji was ordained into the priesthood by the Most Reverend Youssef Bechara, Archbishop of the Maronite Diocese of Antelias, on June 27, 1998 and served until 2005 in Lebanon. Fr. Naji Kiwan's first assignment in our Eparchy was in 2005 as the Vice-Rector of Our Lady of Lebanon Seminary in Washington DC, where he remained until 2007. For a short period of time Fr. Naji served as Assistant Pastor at Saint Anthony of the Desert Church in Fall River, Massachusetts. Fr. Naji served as Administrator of Our Lady of Lebanon Church in Waterbury, Connecticut from 2007 to 2008, until he was assigned Pastor, where he remained until 2011. In 2011 Fr. Naji was assigned Administrator at Saint John Paul II Mission in Sleepy Hollow, NY, and he served as Pastor at Saint Anthony Church in Danbury, CT from 2014 until 2024. As Fr. Naji's final assignment he spent a short time serving as Parochial Vicar in Saint Anthony Church in Glen Allen, VA.

Fr. Naji will then be taken to Lebanon to be buried. Please remember Father Kiwan in the Divine Liturgy. On behalf of the Eparchy of Saint Maron, Clergy, Religious and Lay Faithful, I offer my heartfelt condolences to his family and to all who loved him. May God grant eternal rest to his faithful servant and priest.

EPISTLE

EPHESIANS 3:1-13

Because of this, I, Paul, a prisoner of Christ (Jesus) for you Gentiles-- if, as I suppose, you have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, (namely, that) the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I have written briefly earlier. When you read this you can understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, which was not made known to human beings in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit, that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Of this I became a minister by the gift of God's grace that was granted me in accord with the exercise of his power. To me, the very least of all the holy ones, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the inscrutable riches of Christ, and to bring to light (for all) what is the plan of the mystery hidden from ages past in God who created all things, so that the manifold wisdom of God might now be made known through the church to the principalities and authorities in the heavens. This was according to the eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have boldness of speech and confidence of access through faith in him. So I ask you not to lose heart over my afflictions for you; this is your glory.

SHORT ARTICLES AND NOTES

My Dear Friends:

This weekend I am starting my series on the Acts of Apostles.

In chapter one, Jesus teaches his disciples about His kingdom and He promises them the coming of the Holy Spirit. Then, Jesus commands them to be witnesses to the ends of the earth. After his meeting, Jesus "was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight."

After a while, this first community chose a successor to replace Judas and it was decided that this successor must be a chosen from among the men who "accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us. Beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection." Then, all the community, including Saint Mary the mother of Jesus, prayed. After finishing their prayers the lot fell upon Matthias.

Something to ask ourselves after reading this first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles: How do I help my community stay united in prayer like the Apostles with Mary?
