G Note From Subdeacon Mike

I would like to thank Mark Garrison for joining me this year on our annual retreat at Holy Family Retreat Center in West Hartford. This year's theme was *In My Love, Abide*. We had a moving weekend meeting with men from many different regions and learned of the various struggles they are going through. We prayed for their children or grandchildren; we prayed for some fighting terminal cancer; and we prayed for people that have lost loved ones.

A few of my favorite sessions, in fact, were on praying. Pope Francis has named this year A Year of Prayer as well as a Jubilee Year. We discussed how, when, where and what to pray, and also that there is no right way to pray. Turn off the noise of life, choose a quiet secluded place and clear your thoughts is a great way to begin. We discussed Mark 9:24, "I believe, help my unbelief". We need to ask for guidance in our faith to strengthen our life with Christ. So often we pray and believe our prayers go unanswered. Sometimes they are answered, but we don't hear what is being said. Fr. David, retreat director, taught us that we don't have to say anything when we pray; sometimes we just need to listen. Our Lord will answer your prayers, though we may not get the answer we are looking for.

We welcome anyone that is interested to join us on retreat next year, or if you can't make that weekend, you may choose a different one to attend. Also, there are seven women's retreats which usually sell out.

EPISTLE

2 CORINTHIANS 7:4-11

I have great confidence in you, I have great pride in you; I am filled with encouragement, I am overflowing with joy all the more because of all our affliction. For even when we came into Macedonia, our flesh had no rest, but we were afflicted in every way--external conflicts, internal fears. But God, who encourages the downcast, encouraged us by the arrival of Titus, and not only by his arrival but also by the encouragement with which he was encouraged in regard to you, as he told us of your yearning, your lament, your zeal for me, so that I rejoiced even more. For even if I saddened you by my letter, I do not regret it; and if I did regret it ((for) I see that that letter saddened you, if only for a while), I rejoice now, not because you were saddened, but because you were saddened into repentance; for you were saddened in a godly way, so that you did not suffer loss in anything because of us. For godly sorrow produces a salutary repentance without regret, but worldly sorrow produces death. For behold what earnestness this godly sorrow has produced for you, as well as readiness for a defense, and indignation, and fear, and yearning, and zeal, and punishment. In every way you have shown yourselves to be innocent in the matter. Praise be to God always.

him, she explained in the presence of all the people why she had touched him and how she had been healed immediately. He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you; go in peace." While he was still speaking, someone from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter is dead; do not trouble the teacher any longer." On hearing this, Jesus answered him, "Do not be afraid; just have faith and she will be saved." When he arrived at the house he allowed no one to enter with him except Peter and John and James, and the child's father and mother. All were weeping and mourning for her, when he said, "Do not weep any longer, for she is not dead, but sleeping." And they ridiculed him, because they knew that she was dead. But he took her by the hand and called to her, "Child, arise!" Her breath returned and she immediately arose. He then directed that she should be given something to eat. Her parents were astounded, and he instructed them to tell no one what had happened.

Here are some more thoughts and teachings on our Divine Liturgy: The call to gather to pray at the Church has its origin in God. It is God who calls people together to pray: Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in their midst (MT 18:20).
