

JOHN 1:35-42



First Disciples

The Apostle said: The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!" The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to

them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter). This is the truth. Peace be with you.

WISDOM FROM THE SAINTS *Act, and God will act.* - St Joan of Arc

EPISTLE

2 CORINTHIANS 4:5-15

Brothers and Sisters: We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you. But just as we have the same spirit of faith that is in accordance with scripture — "I believed, and so I spoke" — we also believe, and so we speak, because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

THE OLD TESTAMENT: NUMBERS

The book of Numbers recounts Israel's journey through the wilderness, a long passage marked by God's faithfulness while the people repeatedly struggle with trust and obedience. In the desert God remains present, guiding them by the cloud, feeding them with manna, and speaking through Moses, yet the people often complain, rebel, and lose sight of the promise: "Now the people complained in the hearing of the Lord." (Numbers 11:1). Moreover, the people kept grumbling: "At this, the whole community broke out with loud cries, and even in the night the people wailed. All the Israelites grumbled against Moses and Aaron, the whole community saying to them, would that we had died in the land of Egypt, or that here in the desert we were dead." (Numbers 14:1-4).

Numbers reveal a God who is patient and just, forming His people through discipline and mercy, teaching them that freedom is not only leaving slavery behind but learning to walk faithfully toward the land He has promised: "The Lord said to Moses: Speak to Aaron and his sons and tell them: This is how you shall bless the Israelites. Say to them: The Lord bless you and keep you! The Lord let his face shine upon you, and be gracious to you! The Lord look upon you kindly and give you peace! So shall they invoke my name upon the Israelites, and I will bless them." (Numbers 6:22-27).

SHORT ARTICLES AND NOTES

My Dear Friends:

Recently I read *Defending Life with Compassion and Conviction. A Discussion Guide for Engaging Youth in the Pro- Life Teachings of the Catholic Church*, published as a joint initiative of the Eparchial MYO Office and the Office of Family & Sanctity of Life.

This subject is something so deeply and rooted in our Catholic culture and heart that it can be hard to bring it to the rest of the world. The best way is to pray for our world to be illuminated with new vision and deeper understanding. So, as we approach the March of Life, let us pray with our Church:

Lord God: You are the Author of all life, and every human, seen and unseen, is known and loved by You. We ask You to soften hearts, to heal wounds, and to bring an end to abortion in our world.

Strengthen mothers and fathers in moments of fear, protect the unborn who have no choice, and guide our society toward compassion, truth, and life.

Make us instruments of Your love, so that through our words, choices, and actions, every life may be welcomed and cherished.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Now, I will return to the survey of the Acts of the Apostles. In chapter 22, Saint Paul addresses the crowd in Jerusalem and gives his personal testimony of conversion, speaking in their own language to gain their attention (Acts 22:1-2). He recounts how he once persecuted Christians with zeal, convinced he was serving God, until he was struck by a heavenly light on the road to Damascus and heard the voice of Jesus saying: "I am Jesus the Nazarene whom you are persecuting." (Acts 22:6-8).

Through Paul's witness, the chapter shows how an encounter with the risen Christ can transform hatred into mission and turn a persecutor into an apostle sent to proclaim the Gospel to all nations (Acts 22:14-15, 21).

And finally, the question I would like you to think about this week is: Can you hear the voice of God in your life?

I wish you all a warm and blessed week ahead.
